Admissions Requirements

3. Applicants will have earned a Bachelor's Degree in Physician Assistant studies from an Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant (ARC - PA) accredited physician assistant program (or any of its antecedent organizations grandfathered into the profession prior to 1984), or an earned Associate or Certificate in Physician Assistant studies to be eligible for the non-bachelor equivalency option. (Please contact an Enrollment Counselor at 877.469.2878 for more information about the non-bachelor PA equivalency option). Effective June 1, 2017.

4. All applicants must submit official transcripts from all schools. The program has provided additional clarification that applicants only need to provide official transcripts from all schools where a degree was conferred. Effective June 1, 2017.

The Department of Physician Assistant has withdrawn the new Behavioral Health concentration for the online advanced Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies program. This includes removing the following courses:
